SAFETY WEEK & SAFER INTERNET DAY

This week (the week commencing 10th February 2020) was 'Safety Week' at Stonebroom Primary & Nursery School. The children learned about keeping safe in different situations including: road safety, the fire service, people who help us, safety at home, staying safe online, safety within the school, Forest School safety.

Year 2 & 6 will be visited by the Fire Brigade after half term and taught all about fire safety.

All children took part in workshops led by the Derbyshire County Council Road Safety Team.

We also celebrated 'Safer Internet Day' on Tuesday 11th February with the rest of the world—the slogan was "Together for a Better Internet' -an opportunity to spark a conversation about the safe and responsible use of technology and to inspire young people to create a better internet for the future.

We also held a 'Keep Safe On The Internet' competition. The winners received books and their posters displayed in the IT suite.
