
Christmas is almost upon us-

## **ANTI-BULLYING CAMPAIGN**

The week commencing 16th November 2020 was anti-bullying week at Stonebroom. It is very important to teach children exactly what bullying is and how to deal with it. This year the theme was 'United Against Bullying.'

During anti– bullying week we teach the children that Bullying can be physical, social, cyber or verbal. It can happen anywhere (including online.) The children are taught what to do if they believe that they are being bullied and also that they have a duty to help others should they see bullying taking place.

We have a 'Telling' Box at school. Pupils can share any worries about themselves, or others in this box. We also have a Learning Mentor (Mrs Attenborough) who is always available to listen.

We have an **Anti-**Bullying Governor, Caroline Nash, who keeps up to date with the latest anti-bullying procedures. Leaflets are available on the leaflet stand. There are also child friendly antibullying leaflets availa-

## **BRONZE BEHAVIOUR AWARD**

Some of our pupils have now received their bronze behaviour award and are working towards their silver award. For this academic year only, the children will receive a 'Bronze Award Pencil'.

The pencil will belong to the child and can be taken home or kept in school. Initials/names will be put on the pencils but If they lose their pencil, they will not be given another one (they can be purchased from the office for 50p.)

Every week that a child

does not lose any golden time, they move up the chart. After 10 weeks, they receive their bronze badge and the bronze reward.

After 20 weeks, a child can swap the bronze badge for a silver badge and also receive the silver reward and after 30 weeks they swap the silver badge for the gold badge and are able to access the 'Golden Room.'

## **BEING LATE**

Recently we have had quite a few children arriving at school after the doors have closed— they are then having to access school through the lobby which disturbs the office staff and also the classes.

**Being late** for **school** has a **negative impact** on your child's learning. **Being** just 10 minutes **late** every day adds up to an hour a week of lost learning. Over a year

this adds up to one week of school missed in a year! Being late for class often means important instructions are missed and the class is interrupted.

Please could you get to school on time. If you are late every day, set off 5 minutes earlier!!



#### **MERIT BADGES**

Whilst the bronze, silver and gold badges are linked to behaviour, merits are awarded for outstanding effort in all areas of the curriculum—this could be maths, writing, P.E., computing, artwork etc. When a child has earned 25 merits, they are awarded with a green merit badge.

We were thrilled to award our first green merit badges last week. Once a child has received their green badge, they can work towards their blue badge (50
