BIKEABILITY

Finally, in late April, the Y6 children were able to complete their bikeability level 2 training. The training develops skills for cycling on single-lane roads with simple junctions and moderate traffic and includes the core functions for safe and responsible cycling includ-

- Making good and frequent observations
- Communicating intentions clearly to others.
- Choosing and maintaining the most suitable riding position.
 - Understanding priorities on the road, particularly at junctions.

MERIT BADGES

Merits are awarded for outstanding effort in all areas of the curriculum—this could be maths, writing, P.E., computing, artwork etc. When a child has earned 25 merits, they are awarded with a green merit badge.

Once a child has received their green badge, they can work towards their blue badge (50 merits), yellow badge (75 merits) and red badge (100 merits.)

Once a child has achieved their RED badge, they will then work towards achieving **150 Merit Award**—they can choose a book/books up to the value of £10 with Mrs George.

You will be contacted if your child's uniform is not in line with school policy.


P.E. Kits consist of a plain white t-shirt and dark shorts/joggers/leggings, plimsolls or trainers (to be worn to school on P.E, day.
