LATEST INFORMATION FOR SEPTEMBER 2021

Thank you for all your understanding this year. As yet we are still uncertain about organisation in September, however we do have Plan A, which will go ahead unless you hear otherwise.

PLAN A

The start of the school day Reception Class

Children in Reception will start at 9.00am. They will line up in the courtyard at 9.00am and be collected by their class teacher.

Y1—6 8.45am—8.55am

The pupil entrance door will be opened **from 8.45am** to all pupils from Y1 to Y6. They will simply walk into school and go into their classroom. A member of management will be stood on the main door and teaching staff will be on the school gates (this will be on a rota.) A member of the class teaching team will be in the child's classroom, ready to greet them. **The register will be taken at 8.55am** when all children should be in class, ready to learn.

The end of the school day

Teaching staff will bring their classes out onto the courtyard exactly as they do now. 3.10pm – Reception 3.15pm – Nursery & KS1 3.20pm – KS2

Important Note —Children will arrive/leave school at their own class time, not at the time of their siblings.

AM—8.45am—11.45am PM—12.15pm—3.15pm Don't forget, we also do lunch club at a small cost and offer 30 hour provision.

Breakfast Club

In September, Breakfast Club will just be open as it is now, as a childcare service from 7.45am— 8.45am at a cost of £3.00 per child. If your child is already registered then they can just turn up, you don't need to book a place. Hopefully we will be able to reopen the FREE breakfast club after October half term.

P.E. Kits & Forest School Clothing

We have really thought about the P.E. Kit situation as some parents have told us that they prefer the children to come to school in their P.E. kit and feel that it is more hygienic. However, as a school we have noticed a slight deterioration in pupil attitude and behaviour when they come to school in their P.E. kits and not in school uniform. Learning how to dress themselves is also part of the school curriculum for the younger pupils and for the older pupils, once they have finished the P.E. lesson, they really need to get changed out of their sweaty kits, therefore, **children will be returning to bringing their P.E.**

kit to school on

P.E. day. The same concept applies to Forest School clothing. Bring FS clothes to



school on the Forest School day and the children will get changed at school.

National Tutoring Programme & Catch Up Tuition

The National Tutoring Project (NTP) will continue in September with the current Y5 continuing to receive private tuition from a qualified teacher. The Catch Up tuition will be put on hold for a few weeks whilst we find a replacement teacher for Mrs Hobot.

PARENT SURVEY

Many thanks to all parents who completed and submitted the parent survey. We had a total of 28 responses, the majority of which were very positive and has also given us some areas to develop.

The results as percentages were:

The school is well led and managed—Yes –97%, Unsure—3%.

The school has good facilities— Yes—93%, Unsure— 7%

My child feels very safe and secure at school— Yes— 90%, Unsure 7%, No—3%

My child knows who to approach if they have a worry—Yes—93%, Unsure—7%

I feel that the teaching is good at the school—Yes— $97\%,\,\text{No}{-\!\!\!-\!}3\%$

I know what to do if I have concerns about my child at school—Yes—100\%

I receive clear information about forthcoming events. —Yes—97%, Unsure—3%

My child is making good progress—Yes—93%, Unsure—3%, No-3%

The school has dealt with COVID/lockdown well— Yes—97%, No—3%

I like my child being able to do homework on Seesaw—Yes—61%, Unsure—13%, N/A—11%, No—15%

The school deals effectively with unacceptable behaviour—Yes—89%, Unsure—11%

My child enjoys school—Yes—83%, Sometimes, 15%, No—3%

Strengths include; leadership, communication, excellent staff, reward schemes, play equipment, friendly atmosphere, broad & balanced curriculum, enrichment activities such as Forest School & film making days, well organised

Areas that we are going to look at improving are: teaching children first aid skills (including CPR for the older children), Evidence Me to effectively inform parents in realtime about their child's learning, less focus on homework, getting a new crossing patrol, wider choice of food at lunchtime.
